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POST - PARATHYROIDECTOMY INSTRUCTIONS

OPERATION:	PARATHYROIDECTOMY
WOUND:	Some swelling expected. Use Ice pack for first 24 hours. Steristrips can be removed in the shower 10 days after surgery, or at your follow-up visit. No bandage needed.
DIET:	No diet restrictions. As desired.
MEDICATION:	Resume previous medications, if any. Aspirin can be resumed 48 hours after discharge.
PAIN:	Take 2 Tylenol caps every 4 hours, as needed, or as prescribed. Throat lozenges or Chloraseptic spray as needed for throat pain. Ice Cream / Frozen Yogurt is great!
ΑCTIVITY:	Rest today, resume full activities tomorrow.
MOVEMENT:	Neck movements are encouraged: up, down and side to side.
BATHING:	Taking a shower, washing your hair with shampoo and water is <u>OK after 24 hours of surgery</u> . Pat dry, <u>DO NOT RUB</u> .
THINGS TO LOOK FOR:	Numbness around the lips and tingling in hands or feet may reflect low serum calcium levels. Expected in some patients after successful surgery.
TO DECREASE THESE SYMPTOMS:	Take 1 Tums tablet, 3 times a day, if any tingling.
BLOOD WORK:	Serum calcium level to be drawn the morning after surgery.
